Data governance (DataGov) refers to a broad process of managing the availability, usability, integrity and security of data used in an enterprise. The Data Governance Institute (DGI) defines this concept as follows: "Data Governance is a system of decision rights and accountabilities for information-related processes, executed according to agreed-upon models which describe who can take what actions with what information, and when, under what circumstances, using what methods."
